### Oral and Listening Activities

These activities will help you understand the Cold War and answer our essential questions:

1. What caused the Cold War?
2. How was the Cold War fought and what effects did it have on peoples of the world?
3. Is the world a better place after the ending of the Cold War?

1. Make a PP presentation of 5-6 slides on one of the hotspots of the Cold War. (Remember maximum of 6 lines per slide)

Each slide should address the following:

When did the crisis take place?

What happened?

Who was involved?

Why did it happen?

So what?

Present your PP presentation to at least two classmates who will complete the evaluation rubric.

2. Interview someone that was involved in aspects of the Cold War.

- Develop questions and have them approved by your teacher.

- Present a 3-5 minute speech describing what you learnt about the Cold War from your interview.

Present your interview findings to at least two classmates who will complete the evaluation rubric.

3. Use the at least 3 pictures of the Korean War found in the folder to describe the nature of the war and how it affected civilians and soldiers.

Present your report to at least two classmates who will complete the evaluation rubric.

4. Use a wall map to explain what happened in one of the key events of the Cold War.

Present your explanation to at least two classmates who will complete the evaluation rubric.
